

**SWISS ROOM
CONSTRUCTION
CONTINUES!**

The construction process continues to transform Room 321 in the Cathedral of Learning into the Swiss Nationality Room. Our contractor, PJ Dick, has completed the prep work above the ceiling

and all the base carpentry. As Richard Sink delivers finished wooden room elements he supervises the installation of such complex parts as the carved ceiling beams, the crown molding, and the rosettes. The oak floor is laid and the complicated fitting of the LED lighting into the ceiling beam rosettes is done. Wall and ceiling panels and the wall molding elements are being delivered as I write this report.

Richard is working day-to-day with site supervisor Don Show, project manager Shaun Mason and architect-of-record Stephen Altherr on installation and construction design issues that arise. Scheduling issues are managed by Rich Vogel of the Cathedral's Facility Management Department. Site meetings are held every two weeks at the room to keep the information flow fresh and questions answered as quickly and efficiently as possible. I personally stay busy keeping the

SNRC and S-ASP up to speed on this progress. Architect Stephen Altherr stays busy making decisions on everything from the window sill trim to the door handles to the Swiss Cross window opening in the door. Stephen keeps artistic architectural director Justin Rüssli apprised at his studio in Luzern.

Work will continue in Richard Sink's studio near Helvetia, WV from mid-November to mid-December on the radiator covers, projection box, display cases, and framing for the blackboard, windows, and AC diffuser coverings. Dave Houser, of Moatsville, WV, is completing the leaded and stained glass windows at present and will be delivering them to Richard's studio for framing in early December.

FINAL STRETCH DETAILS!

A sound narrative that will play as one enters the room has been completed in script form by SNRC members Carlson, Smith, and Kunz in conjunction with Rooms Director Maxine Bruhns. Maxine will recite the narrative and it will be activated by a toggle switch inside the doorway telling the story of the Swiss Room. The Dedication Book (which will be handed to everyone at the Dedication and will stand as the permanent record of Swiss history, the Room elements, and a complete history of the Swiss Room planning) has been drafted by Fred Carlson with editing assistance from Philip Bottonari, Jhon Smith, Heinz Kunz, and Maxine Bruhns. Fred is currently placing this text into a design program and is selecting graphics and photos that illustrate our 13-year story. The room plaque text has been completed by Fred and Maxine. The Donor Book text has been completed in alphabetical order making it easy for readers to find their loved ones in the Donor list with the testimonials. Dr. Kunz is managing the volunteer tasks related to the Dedication ceremony set for Sunday, April 22, 2012 and the banquet tentatively scheduled the night before on Saturday, April 21.

KACHELOFEN PROGRESS

In mid-September the interior carpentry for the Kachelofen, created by Don Marchese of Custom Wood & Laminate, was delivered to Red Clay Tileworks. Andy Anderson of Red Clay is currently creating the molds and pressing the tiles for the Kachelofen. Antiquing painter Gina Chalfant will

be adding her decorative glazes and colors to the tiles and Andy and Don hope to have the Kachelofen slid into place in the front right corner of the room by year-end. Andy's studio in Bellevue is open for members of the S-ASP to visit, but call first 412.734.2222. The Swiss images on this Kachelofen are collected from the Graaf Family Kachelofen on display at the Winterthur Museum in Zürich and arranged by Dr. Kunz and Evelyn Ruffing. We again thank Ed Graf for conceiving of and underwriting this important addition to the room.

LAST MINUTE SCHEDULING

1. When you visit the room during the December 4 Open House, it will still appear to be a construction site. By year-end we expect the room to be basically done and the contractor's presence and equipment to be removed. Classes are scheduled to start January 3 in the room, but 3 things are still likely to be completed early in 2012. The trestle tables will be in place as of January 3, 2012, but ordinary classroom seats for the students will be in place until late January when Richard will deliver the assembled *stabellen* chairs and teacher's lectern.
2. The Kachelofen, if not installed in late December, may need one day for installation sometime in early 2012. We are not rushing Ed Graf's team of vendors to get it in place by January 3, but the team is using that date for deadline focus.
3. The frieze will be retrofitted onto the crown molding in late March 2012 or over Pitt's Spring Break. Everything will be in place for the Dedication April 22, 2012. The sketches for this frieze have already begun at Pat Sink's studio in Salem, South Carolina.

OTHER ARTWORK: FREIZE, MAP, PORTRAITS

As mentioned before, the frieze will be completed by Richard Sink and his artist mother Pat Sink after January 1, 2012, but will be installed before the dedication. This frieze is a 88-foot long wooden mural that goes all the way around the

room where the ceiling molding meets the walls. The frieze depicts a vine of life motif with associated images of harvest, plenty, fruit, birds, farmer costumes, etc. The negative spaces are carved into the wood about one quarter inch and the flush surfaces are painted a subdued set of ochres, greens and reds. The antique map of Switzerland donated by Dr. Kunz and the two portraits of Pestalozzi and Rousseau donated by Fred Carlson will take their place framed in the room in December. Dr. Kunz has graciously underwritten the framing of Fred Carlson's two portraits of Pestalozzi and Rousseau done in the style of Basler Hans Holbein, and these frames match the frame on the antique map.

LOOKING AHEAD INTO 2012

Invitations for the Dedication and Banquet are scheduled to go out to all donors, S-ASP members, and local dignitaries in late February. All events related to the Dedication and Banquet will be rsvp'd from these invitations. If you have particular names you wish to be invited please give those names and addresses to Dr. Kunz and Bruce Kuenzi asap as we develop this invitation list fully in early 2012. If you are wondering if someone you know is on the donor list or not, ask Fred Carlson. We expect Ambassador Barras and some of his team from NYC to be present at the Dedication. We have volunteer help with this team effort from S-ASP Board members Bruce Kuenzi, Walter Schaller, Paul Lienhardt, Tim Maddamma, Koni Ostertag, and Jhon Smith so far and we welcome your assistance. Evelyn Ruffing reports that with all Swiss punctuality, even the Swiss Room dedication key is now complete, based on the Obwalden key. Thanks to Evelyn for overseeing this important addition to the dedication ceremony for next spring, and to Jane Lubic for underwriting the key's cost.

FINAL FUNDRAISING

SNRC members Philip Bottonari, Walter Schaller, and Fred Carlson are creating a year-end appeal to focus on 3 needs we still have. Although the construction costs have been met, our Room Committee will be seeking assistance to:

1. "Unfreeze the Frieze": to help complete full funding of this important decorative element to crown the Swiss Room with its beauty
2. Assist with Dedication Ceremony costs, and to
3. Begin Scholarships Fundraising.

We ask that if you can, be generous with us and this year-end giving opportunity. You know we have been as frugal as possible with the entire progress of the Swiss Room construction. We want to make sure our final preparations are fully funded so the Swiss Room can receive the ceremony it deserves.
