now famous Steinstossen, a Waltz and Polka Competition (see below), and for the first time a Lampionumzug (candle-lit paper lantern parade) for children. The latter is a tradition in Switzerland, together with a bonfire (which is not a possibility in North Park). Ambassador Heinz Kunz went, following a suggestion, to extraordinary measures to bring in a supply of traditional paper lanterns in time for the picnic. At twilight, they were distributed to the children, the candles lit and those of us who grew up in Switzerland had an experience not had in many a year: the sight of earnest and joyful children parading with lanterns celebrating the founding of the old country.

Steinstossen and Waltz and Polka Competition

Steinstossen (stone throwing) proved to be very popular again this year. Forty-nine people participated in a record breaking competition. The new record throw (12.325 kg stone) in the men's division of 21'4" was made by T. McBurney. Rosemary Gubser broke her own record throw of last year, to repeat as best in the women's division. Last year Ms. Gubser's throw (5.7 kg stone) measured 16'5", this year it measured an amazing 18'6". (For comparison, the record throw at this year's Unspunnen festival in Switzerland, the grand daddy of Swiss Steinstossen events was 12'6". The stone, however, weighs 93.5 kg or 206.1 lbs).

Arthur and Franziska Rudolf waltzed their way into first place as winners in the waltz contest. They were awarded a bottle of wine for their efforts. In the polka competition, Bill Englert and Gloria Sutter demonstrated some fancy footwork to win first place and a bottle of wine. The music was provided by the Ed Hrabel Band and Consul Heinz Kunz and Conrad Ostertag served as judges.
