Swiss Nationality Room News

The Swiss Nationality Room Committee met on October 15 at the Braun Conference Room in the Cathedral of Learning at the University of Pittsburgh. The agenda was full and the meeting was

very productive. We had a look back on a year where the Swiss Room brochure has made an impact in our outreach and fund raising, and we looked forward to another level of corporate and endowment funding outreach led by a number of strategies and including new input from interested Swiss. Let me briefly recap the meeting and progress for our Swiss community, and thank one and all who have contributed in any way to our continued progress.

The Composition of the Committee

We were heartened by the attendance at this meeting. The Committee currently includes Chairman Heinz W. Kunz, Ph.D., Honorary Consul of Switzerland, Co-chair Fred Carlson and Nancy Flury Carlson, Treasurer Walter Schaller, Catherine Hebert, Evelyn Ruffing, Pat Heer, and Edythe Bottonari. All members except Edythe were able to attend this meeting. Charles Buenzli, secretary of the Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh, has made his enthusiasm for helping with fund raising strategies known to the Committee and we will be working through some of Charles' suggestions with his advice in 2002. We also had a guest, Swiss Albert Tannler, Executive Director of the Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation, who made some good suggestions to the process of finding the right and most efficient architectural and interior design services. We thank members Alex Bally, Margrit Wyler, and Fran Hoffmann Reichel for their former service since they have moved away from the area.

The Room Design

The room design has been described in the brochure in general ways. This meeting included discussion of various ways to acquire or make a kachelhofen. We

were introduced to the names of US-based craftsmen that could help in the woodworking, furniture building, and glass and tile crafting. The decision was made to carve the cantonal symbols on the back of the classroom chairs, since these symbols represent so much of the meaning of the local culture. The four original cantons could be represented in discrete ways in the leaded glass windows, which were to be kept simple as the 18th century style dictated. A map circa 1700 of the 13 cantons at the time will be installed in a wall case. Fred Carlson is working on a color room rendering to aid in fund raising efforts and publicity for the project. Park Rankin, Senior Manager of Architecture for the University Planning, Design, and Construction Department, presented information on room requirements that are necessary for all University room upgrades.

Publicity for the Project

Catherine Hebert has written an article to be circulated to Swiss-American and Swiss publications, especially to be featured in the Regional News in Swiss Review Magazine. Dr. Kunz will be keeping the project visible among the diplomatic corps and the registered Swiss in his western PA consular area, and begin work with outreach to Swiss companies with American locales, with information from his contacts with the embassy. All local Swiss are urged to be spokesmen for the project and feel free to contact the committee (Co-chair Carlson has more brochures and will be happy to send brochures to contacts you suggest) with any and all leads you may have for donors.

Current Fund raising Status

The Treasurer, Walter Schaller, reported that we have passed the \$26,000 mark in

our accounts. The Nationality Rooms Director, Maxine Bruhns, is pleased with the support from the local Swiss community. There are requests to build rooms for other countries from wealthy people who want to fund it themselves and Maxine reports that they are told "No, you need to have a community in Pittsburgh." It is obvious to her that the Swiss of Western PA are behind this effort 100%. We will be multiplying our efforts in 2002 to enlist more of our talented committee members to coordinate new fund raising work to major endowments, Swiss companies here and abroad, and other corporate sources in Pittsburgh. Mailings, phone calls, and personal visits will all be included in this strategy. Another spring Swiss event hosted by the Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh will be announced shortly to keep the project visible locally to our Swiss community and friends.

December 2 Open House at the Cathedral of Learning.

The Swiss Room Committee and members of the Swiss American Society of Pittsburgh will be included in the December 2 Holiday Open House selling fund raising items and publicizing our
