Our recent 5-language 16 page book THE SWISS NATIONALITY ROOM has been mailed to many new prospects around the world thanks to the efforts of fund raising committee members Walter Schaller and Charles Buenzli. The entire book will be readable soon as a pdf file on the new www.swisspittsburgh.org website recently created by Charles Buenzli. This site, also hotlinked to the University of Pittsburgh Nationality Rooms site, plans to be a source uniting the news relating to the Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh events, the Swiss Nationality Room Committee project, and the Helvetia Männerchor Swiss singers. This site is currently under construction but should be a helpful resource for guiding interested Swiss and "friends of Switzerland" to read for themselves the Swiss Room project's intent and generate another level of donations through the web. Fred Carlson also fulfilled requests from the DC Swiss Club, and their President Walter von Rautencratz, for 200 copies of the booklet, and for another 50 to go to the South Florida Swiss and their President, Emil Zahner. These books were distributed at August 1 Festivities at the Swiss Embassy in Washington DC and in Bonita Springs, Florida. Contributions are starting to come in from this

new outreach. We ask our membership that if they need copies of this book to give to possible donors, please ask a S-ASP board member or a Room Committee member and they will gratefully get copies to those people you designate. We need the help of ALL Swiss as ambassadors for this important project.

With the investment climate getting more positive, our Swiss Room Fund raising Chair Charles Buenzli is crafting a new round of outreach for funding from the Frick Foundation, the HJ Heinz Foundation, and the US Steel Foundation. We are planning a second round of mailing outreach to previous donors NOT members of the Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh in the next few months in an effort guided by Walter Schaller. We have received substantial donations from supporters of the project from CH, many of whom are Pitt alumni. The first 10 months of 2003 saw our finances benefit by about \$5500.- in donations through the Society events and through other mailing outreach, and we continue to look for greater numbers as our corporate outreach begins to be reviewed in an optimistic business climate. Current level of funding for our project is approximately \$42,000.- at press time.

**EAST PITTSBURGH UNITED
SWISS BROTHERS MEMORABILIA
DONATED TO HEINZ HISTORY
CENTER** by Trudy Kuenzi,

At the Swiss Farm Dairy office attic this past summer, relatives and friends of John Fankhauser discovered 4 important framed historical pieces relating to the history of the United Swiss Brothers, a forerunner of the Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh. History of the club between 1905 and 1966 was documented in these framed pictorial documents discovered off Churchill Road up the hill from Turtle Creek. Three of these framed items were displayed at the August 1 picnic and have been donated to the Heinz History Center by Bruce and Trudy Kuenzi.

These fascinating objects included: 1. The original charter of the UNITED SWISS BROTHERS of EAST PITTSBURGH dated April 1, 1905. This charter was recognized by decree of the Allegheny Court of Common Pleas No. 2 approving the application for charter by a certificate of authorization. 2. This first photographic

piece represents every member of the organization from 1903-1918. Depictions of all the Swiss cantons surround the photos of the members titled in German: East Pittsburgh Ver Schweitzerbrüder. 3. This next photographic piece shows individuals from the 1928 member list. The club had shrunk slightly from 1918, but had a building on Electric Avenue in East Pittsburgh. This building still stands today but is not occupied. 4. This final photographic piece is a montage of members dating from 1903-1958.

Many members of today's Swiss-American Society of Pittsburgh enjoyed seeing loved ones in these framed photo groupings at the picnic this past summer along with many familiar names! The Heinz History Center showed interest in these items and took them on September 12, 2003 for their educational archives, along with three sets of membership cards dating from 1963, 1965, and 1966. Thanks to Bruce and Trudy Kuenzi for following through with this donation of Swiss heritage to our Heinz regional history museum.
