Swiss Nationality Room News

The Swiss Nationality Room funds are currently at \$51,266.05 in all accounts including the University account. The recent 'tombola' or door raffle, at the Swiss National Day Picnic raised \$187. as we huddled together under the pavilion at the Bethel Park Lions Club site with rain all around.

On August 1st, Swiss Room committee chairman Dr. Heinz Kunz made a special interview appearance at WPIT radio station with host Heino Coelle on the 'German Hour' show, promoting the society and our room project to the Pittsburgh public.

A mailing of our 16-page 5-language booklet went to 80 Swiss media sources in August to prompt awareness of the project in CH. Nancy Flury Carlson researched this list of Swiss media and this will be a very helpful resource in future fundraising and promotion efforts. Only 4 of the packets were returned "forwarding order expired-return to sender". Considering some of the addresses were a year old, this is not a bad percentage! Dr. Kunz fielded calls from some of the Swiss media with followup questions. Domestic contributions continue to come in regularly from all over the U.S.

Our concept design is agreed upon by our committee and we look forward soon to engage a CH/PA registered architect to create plans that can be submitted to NRIEP (Nationality Rooms and Intercultural Exchange Program) for approval. The Swiss Room will again participate in the Nationality Room Open House in December. Walter Schaller will feature the "fondue table" again! All members are encouraged to come in traditional dress to help man the table and promote our room project!

We are due to file an official letter of extending our fundraising and more specific fundraising targeting as our covenant with the University asks. Our bequest is now over 5 years old and we are responsible for a more detailed fundraising document in the near future. Charles Buenzli, our fundraising chair, continues to make our room project known to the endowment community and he is hopeful that with increasing economic good news our specific requests may be taken off 'no' or 'hold' and begin to be approved.

Swiss News September 27, 2004

Dashing the chance for almost 200,000 youngsters to get citizenship easily voters in Switzerland rejected two government proposals to loosen tough naturalization rules in a referendum. Nearly 57 percent of voters opposed granting automatic citizenship to third-generation children born to immigrant families.

In other questions, voters supported a government-paid national maternity leave system, but rejected a citizen initiative to block the closure of small post offices to save money.

About a fifth of the 7.2 million people living in Switzerland are not citizens, most of them immigrants from Italy and the Balkans or their off-string.
