We have a beginning balance as of August 31, 2004 of \$7574.42. Income was \$1639.17 and expenses were \$1415.75 leaving a ending balance as of December 31, 2004 of \$7797.84.

Membership Statistics

Three applications for S.A.S. membership were approved by the Board. We welcome as new members Roy and Carol Negley, Dawn Harvey, and Bud Kohler. Since we issue membership on a family basis, it is difficult to state an exact member count. Currently we have 43 paid and 15 dues exempt (life and honorary) families. For example the Swiss National Day Picnic attendance is usually about 100 members and guests.

Obituary. Sophie Vonderach passed away at 95 years of age on March 1, 2005 in Sunnyvale, California. She met and married Stephen Vonderach in Pittsburgh in 1933. Her husband of 63 years preceeded her in death in 1996. Sophie and Stephen were long time and active members of our Swiss Club. They participated as a family in the Pittsburgh Folk Festivals held at the old Syria Mosque in Oakland. Her husband, Stephen was a baker by trade and many of his baked goods ended up on the tombola tables. Our Swiss Society has given a monetary contribution to the Swiss Nationality classroom in her name.

The Alliance of Germanic Societies of Pittsburgh

Since the year 1998, the Swiss American Society has been an active member of the Germanic Alliance. We participated in

the 1998 Summerfest held at Station Square which resulted in a substantial gain in our membership. However, in recent years the Alliance has faltered somewhat. It has been realized by some of the member organizations that a decision needs to be made. "Should we continue on or dissolve the Alliance?" Two meetings were held at the law offices of Meyer, Unkovic and Scott in downtown Pittsburgh on February 7 and March 21, 2005. A vote was taken by the delegates attending. The result was to continue on and not to dissolve the Alliance.

It was decided to have one event per a year. This year it will be on or near German-American Day, which is October 6th, because on that date in 1683, 13 German families from Krefeld near the Rhine founded the 1st German settlement, Germantown, PA. The designation "German" is used in a cultural, not in a political sense thus including the German speaking Swiss, Alsations, Austrians, Germans, from Eastern Europe, and German Jews.

Details will follow later.

Savory-style Pear Dessert Recipe

Many people requested the recipe for the dessert served at Swiss Night. Here it is.

Peel, halve and core the pears and thinly slice. Melt butter in raclette dish and arrange the pears in a fan shape. Sprinkle with sugar and cook for a few minutes on the grill top until the pears are just soft. Pour some cream over them and slide the pans under the grill and cook gently until the sauce is slightly caramelized.

We prefer Bosc pears and slice them about 3/16 inch thick.
