The minutes of December 4, 1971 were read and approved.

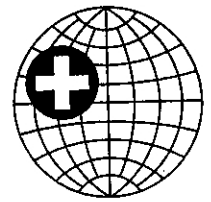

With this writing, we would like to find out whether you are interested in a visit of our president to your community. These contacts will be established in order to inform the Swiss living in the United States and Canada of the following matters:

- various problems concerning Switzerland and the Organization of the Swiss abroad of the New Helvetic Society, as well as the services of its secretariate in Berne;
- inquiry on the particular problems of the Swiss living in North America as to their relationship to Switzerland and to the Organization of the Swiss abroad.

Mr. Guisan, being an active member of our Parliament, disposes of a wide range of topics to be discussed, i.e.:

- the Organization of the Swiss abroad and the services it provides
- the present political situation in Switzerland
- the 8th revision of the Swiss social security system
- the problem of a possible readaptation of the Swiss constitution

Enclosed you will find the itinerary of our president showing you at what date he will be in your area. Kindly inform us as soon as possible if, at what exact date, and under what kind of circumstances a meeting between our president and your society could be held. Furthermore, let us know whether some personal contacts could be established with individual members who are representative for your group or who have very special problems.



Dear Mrs. Kuenzi,

The accordion orchestra of Peter Frey, well known in Europe through various concerts, broadcasts and records, plans a concert trip through the Eastern part of the United States this coming summer.

Our orchestra consists of 19 young people (18-22 years of age), three girls, ten boys and three married couples. We play outstanding pieces of classic music as well as Swiss folklore tunes. It is also planned to take along two fine jodlers.

In 1969 our orchestra has - in cooperation with the Office for the Swiss abroad in Berne - successfully made a concert trip through South American countries. The same office has now encouraged us to plan a trip to the United States and has given us your address.

Our trip is planned to take place from July 13, 1972 to August 4, 1972. According to our tentative schedule we would arrive in Pittsburgh on July 22 and leave again on July 23. So on the day of arrival we could give a concert in your area which would not only interest your members but most certainly a large crowd from your city. In this connection we would need your assistance in organizing such a concert, selecting the locality, announcing the event etc.

It should also be mentioned that we have no sponsors for our trip and should thus be able to obtain some money from entrance fees to apply against the cost of the travel arrangements.



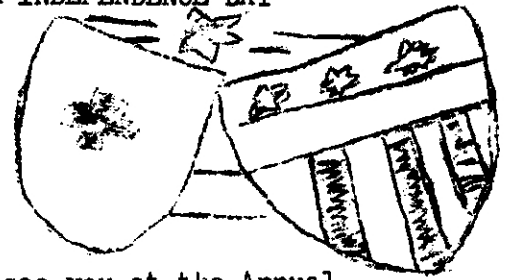
As to the Sugar Creek trip Sept. 30th a separate letter will be sent in late August when more definite information for a chartered bus and price can be had. The President will check this out.



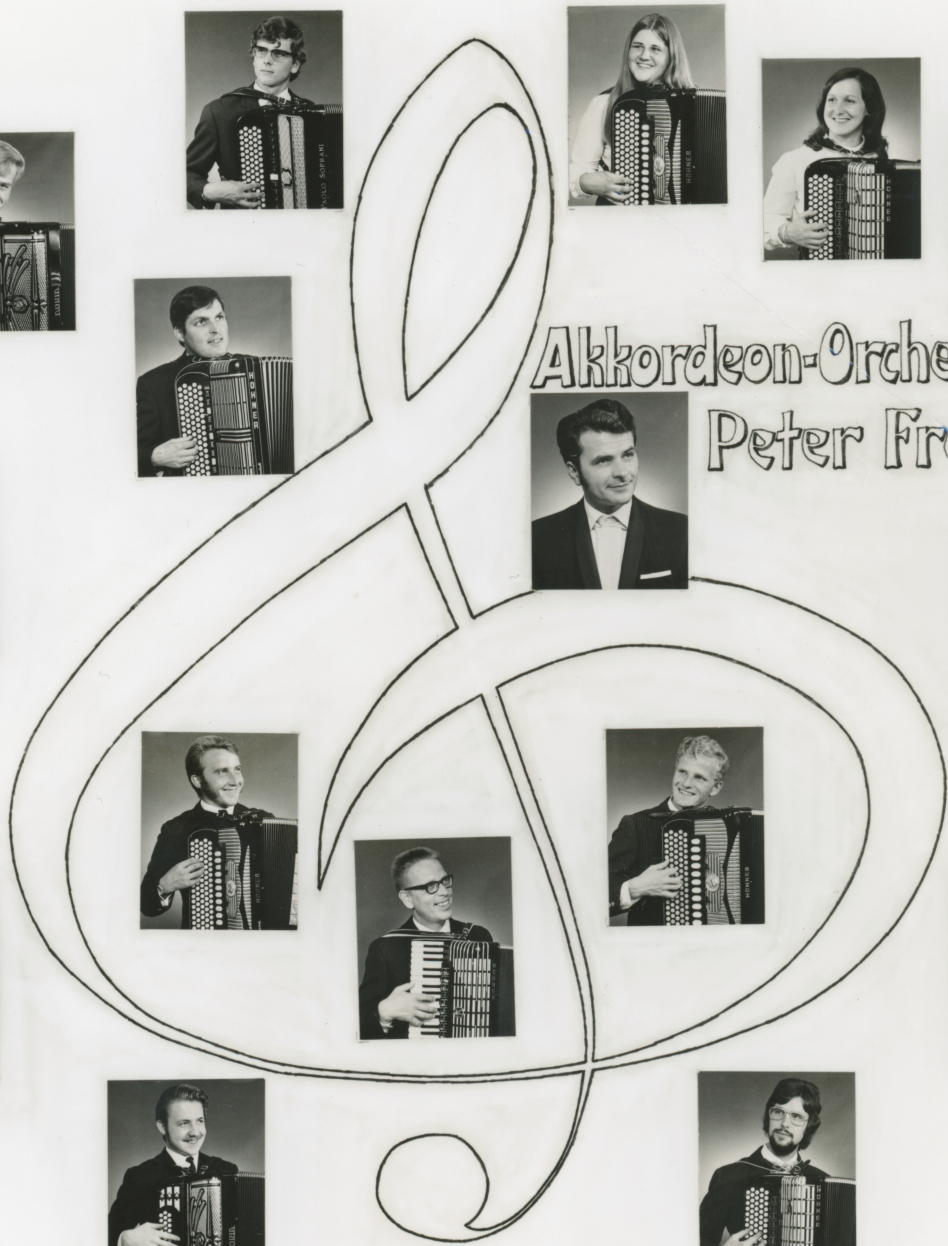
