We have been approached by many of your fellow Swiss residing in the U. S. A., asking if we could supply them with Bundnerfleisch, (Swiss Dried Beef of the Grisons). It seems that only a few, in the large cities, have access to this delicacy.

The Bundnerfleisch is available in cryovac wrapped pieces, each one weighing from 5 to 7 pounds. It has occurred to us that perhaps as a service to your members, you would like to make this delicacy available to them.

As you may be aware, here in New York, when one can find it, Bundnerfleisch sells for \$8.50 per pound. In order to satisfy as many people as possible, we are prepared to offer it to you for \$7.25 per pound, postage prepaid, in pieces as described above.

We would be most interested in your views on this subject.
