Dear Compatriots and Friends,

In going through the Consular files I have found a total of three lists with addresses of Swiss and Swiss friends in my consular district. One is the list of the Pittsburgh Consulate, another one is the list of the Swiss American Society of Pittsburgh and the third is the one of the Consulate General of Switzerland in New York. Some of the names appear on all three lists but for understandable reasons many appear only on one list especially since many of you may be matriculated at the Consulate General but did not register with the Consulate in Pittsburgh or did not join the Swiss American Society. On the other hand many of you may be of Swiss descent but may not hold Swiss citizenship, or you may be friends of Switzerland who have been faithfully maintaining your membership with the local Swiss American Association. All in all I have counted a total of 361 names which is quite a respectable number.

I thought it would be a good idea, and to the benefit of all concerned, if our consular file be properly updated and I, therefore, need your cooperation.

In the enclosure I am sending you a form which I like you to complete and return to me as soon as possible in the enclosed self addressed envelope.

You will note that the questionnaire asks what languages you speak. I am sure some of you who still speak your native tongue do not often have an opportunity to speak it. Hopefully your completing that section of the questionnaire will lead to increased activities of sharing our traditions and cultural backgrounds.

If for some reason you do not care to provide me all of the requested information this is alright with me, but at least complete the portion which provides the full and correct name and your mailing address.

At this opportunity I give you my solemn assurance that the information you provide will be for this Consulate only and will be kept as strictly confidential. Your cooperation in my effort will be much appreciated.


RESUME OF ACTIVITIES FOR 1983
