The silent auction will continue as the dance music of the Hauskapelle Band starts. Winners of the various goods, art pieces, and services from the silent auction will be announced as the music provides an entertaining backdrop. The monies raised at the event and concurrent auction will keep our announcer busy reporting to attendees on the progress of our fundraising effort. By 10PM, our biggest auction items will have been won and we'll really have some good news to report! The band will play on until 11PM when the event will conclude.

## Swiss American Society of Pittsburgh, Board of Directors Meeting, February 6, 1998

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 PM by President Frederick H. Carlson. Present were Vice President Frank Gloor, Treasurer Walter Schaller, Secretary Nancy Flury Carlson, Membership Secretary Trudy Kuenzi, and Directors Conrad Ostertag, and Lizann Maddamma and Al von Arx. Director Roseann Habegger and Consul Heinz Kunz were unable to attend due to schedule conflicts.

### Reports

#### *Minutes*

The meeting minutes of the Board of Directors meeting were accepted as corrected (noting date changes for the Sami Klaus and Holiday Dinner). In addition, notes from the Holiday Dinner meeting were also distributed.

#### *Membership*

Trudy Kuenzi presented the Membership report which was accepted as submitted. Two members, Marie Leuenberger and Betty Montgomery, have passed away in recent months. Flowers were sent from the society. Alfred Mayenzet resigned and moved to Washington State. Membership Statistics: 14 honorary; 5 life; 5 golden age; 150 paid; 29 delinquent letters sent

#### *Treasurer*

Walt Schaller presented the Treasurer's report, indicating a balance of \$4466.44 as of 2 6 98. The report was accepted as submitted.

### Old Business

#### *Nationality Room - formation of fund raising committee*

FHC related correspondence from Heinz Kunz regarding Nationality room effort, indicating the the Consul would support the effort.

Fred reintroduced the idea to start a new tradition, to devote 1 3 of our yearly calendar to Nationality Room fund raising: is there commitment from the board? Discussion as to whether it's feasible - looking at the 1960s with the society participating Folk Festival which did make money and still not being able to fund a nationality room. Can we establish a long-range financial planning committee who would develop and follow up leads for funding strategies. Evelyn Ruffing has already volunteered to work on this committee. This committee would not have to attend board meetings but could report back. Fred compiled list of suggested names to contact as possible committee members. Coni suggested we get in touch with someone from the Austrian Society who had established a Nationality Room (Franz Stahr). Heinz may be able to approach Swiss corporate sponsors on behalf of the Society. Board would continue to organize annual fund raising event; this committee would be independent of that effort and would concentrate on long-range fund raising strategies and actions. The board agreed that the formation of the committee should go forward and that the committee and board should begin by gathering the appropriate information to make and informed feasibility assessment.

#### *Nationality Room - Spring Fund Raising event*

Walt indicated Saturday May 2 is reserved at Teutonia Hall: ideas include entertainment—Hauskappelle (available for \$350; they are holding date for us; if we want a contract get in touch with them. Since Coni and Walt know them, contract not necessary. NFC will draft letter of acknowledgement for our records and to send to them.), Barons, Alpenglo (not available); alphorn playing; Maennerchor; appetizers, fondue, raclette; silent auction (solicit services or items from membership). Fred would like to send mailing in 3<sup>rd</sup> week February to solicit two things: cash for the fund raising effort, and/or silent auction ideas. Coni suggested owner of the Priory is Swiss (restaurant inn) could be solicited. This would be followed up in March with a definite schedule

(OVER)



Proposed ticket price \$20 since it's a fund raiser; this should net in the neighborhood of \$1000 in ticket money with attendance similar to picnic.

Hall costs \$150. Cheese for raclette/fondue \$100.

Expense of the two mailings would be about \$100 or less. Board sentiment was not to include stamped envelope, but do include self-addressed envelope.

Tentative schedule:

6:30 - 7:30 cash bar and beginning browsing for auction items  
7:30 - 7:50 Maennerchor  
8:15 band starts  
9:00 auction announcements  
10:00 final announcement of biggest ticket items  
11:00 end

Consider food items in addition to the raclette -- we should check with the Teutonia on the availability of hot hors d'oeuvres. Optional dinner could also be organized; Walt to check on the availability of the downstairs, or we would have to have food upstairs.

Board discussed whether we could forego the May business meeting; NFC raised a point of procedure regarding bylaws requirement to hold an annual business meeting for the general membership. NFC to determine from bylaws.

## **New Business**

### ***Alliance of Germanic Societies***

They foster communication among Germanic peoples. Should we join this alliance for \$10? Entitled to two voting and two alternate representatives. Acknowledged that past concerns have been expressed regarding joining an organization that does not include French, Italian and Romansch Swiss. However, strong support was stated in favor of the alliance for the networking opportunity in light of our strategic plans for fund raising. Board moved to empower Walt to coordinate. Next meeting is the 16<sup>th</sup> February; two representatives can attend. Coni is already a member; Fred may be able to attend.

### **Christmas Dinner**

Where and when? A couple of complaints were received about the food at the Teutonia. Should we move it to another location? Is the Priory too expensive? Could we consider a lunch to reduce cost and allow people to travel home? Proposed dates: Sunday December 6 for luncheon, December 12 for Sami Klaus. NFC to check Hoffstadt's. Lizann checking Peter's Place & Tambellini's. Coni checking Priory. Trudy will check Fountain Room. Time 2:00 ish.

### **Trips?**

Are we ever going to take any more trips to New Glarus, Helvetia, Sugar Creek? Fred will include question in fund raising letter to see if there is interest.

## UPDATE ON ACTIVITIES

Before we meet next (we need to meet later in March to finalize plans on the fundraiser, confirm specific plans for Christmas luncheon and August 1st Picnic) I wanted to note various items that have occurred since our productive meeting at Walter Schaller's last 6 February.

### FIRST MAILING ON FUNDRAISER

Nancy and I mailed out the first information mailing on our fundraiser, with update on efforts to mobilize the Swiss Heritage Room at the University of Pittsburgh, request for silent auction items, and request for contributions. We received \$220.- the first week. I'm working on the copy and design for the invitation to go out in early April and I'll be showing you that material at our next Board meeting. Dr. Heinz Kunz, Honorary Consul, will be sending a mailing through the Swiss Consulate to 400 registered Swiss citizens in Dr. Kunz' Western Pennsylvania area (see update below on my meeting with Dr. Kunz).

### ALLIANCE OF GERMANIC SOCIETIES

We joined the Alliance to promote our fundraising and other activities to this group. I attended their 16 Feb meeting at the GBU Building in Brentwood. They meet every other month to share news and activities. Walt Schaller represents the Kinderchor and Connie Ostertag represents the Helvetia Mannerchor in this group. They were glad to have us involved. I met a representative from the Austrian Society (the Novaks) and heard news of their fundraising efforts to start the Austrian Room at Pitt.

### ALLIANCE FRANCAISE OF PITTSBURGH

At the urging of Dr. Kunz, I contacted the Alliance Francaise and spoke to Stefan Ramagnolo. They have office space at Chatham College. I sent him news of our efforts and schedule of activities and a sample membership application for any French-speaking Swiss in his group.

### MEETING WITH HONORARY CONSUL

At the invitation of Dr. Heinz Kunz, I met him for lunch at the PAA club to discuss strategies to set up a credible effort for a Nationality Room at the University of Pittsburgh. We last received material from Maxine Bruhns, Director of the Nationality Rooms, early in 1993. Dr. Kunz spoke with her and we will be receiving new materials shortly, afterwards a meeting will be set up with the three of us to discuss formation of a Nationality Room committee. During this year, when the German Room is celebrating its 60th year of existence, we also learn that the Japanese

are starting fundraising for a room and also the Danes! Dr. Kunz recalled the beginning of the Nationality Room fund and was happy we were serious about fundraising. He noted that we need to publicize our efforts to the French and Italian speaking Swiss in the area as well (hence the outreach to Alliance Francaise) and he specifically knew of French speaking Swiss at CMU. He mentioned he would send a mailing through the Consulate to 400 registered Swiss in Western Pennsylvania with news of our efforts (in multiple languages!). We will have provision for these Swiss to be welcomed to our event and learn more about the Nationality Room effort.

He suggested we need to change the name of the fund to the Swiss Nationality Room Fund since no one group can 'create' the committee to start a room at Pitt. We need to constitute a University of Pittsburgh Nationality Room Committee with people from our Society as well as other representatives from the area to properly represent the Swiss heritage to the University. This effort will be parallel to our effort to begin a long-term financial committee from our group and should occur as soon as possible.

He said we could expect support through business and diplomatic channels once our serious effort is underway and he would support it in every way he could. News of our effort could be expected to spread to other Swiss groups in the United States and in Switzerland through the consulate and attache communities. We spoke generally that the proposed room would need to represent the total Swiss ethnic heritage and it needs to follow strict design guidelines mentioned in the literature from the University. We need to raise \$5000.- to reserve a room in the Cathedral of Learning. Our official room committee would need to enter into an official relationship with the University, we would pay \$100.-/year to be on their Nationality Room Board, and we would be responsible in the future (when the room would open) to do holiday decorating and other educational activities there.

#### CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON NEWS

Through the efforts of Lizann Maddamma, we received an encouraging Christmas Luncheon proposal from Tambellini's on Rt 51. If we have the event on Saturday, Dec 5th, 1998, we can reserve a 120-seat room there, the price is approximately \$14.-/person for food, tax, gratuity, they have a good wide-offering menu (which they are sending to us for our decision making), and they have carafes of wine available. This seems to fit our needs (price, location, luncheon format) and the contact is a Swiss from New Glarus, WI!

Look for a Board announcement soon, and again, thanks to Dr. Kunz for his generous input. Respectfully submitted,

## **Swiss American Society of Pittsburgh, Board of Directors Meeting, March 24, 1998**

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by President Frederick H. Carlson. Present were Consul Heinz Kunz, Vice President Frank Gloor, Treasurer Walter Schaller, Secretary Nancy Flury Carlson, Membership Secretary Trudy Kuenzi, and Directors Conrad Ostertag, Lizann Maddamma, Al von Arx and Roseann Habegger.

### **Reports**

#### **Minutes**

The meeting minutes of the Board of Directors meeting of February 6, 1998 were accepted as read.

#### **Membership**

Trudy Kuenzi presented the Membership report which was accepted as submitted. Total membership is 182. Trudy read the thank you from Florence Jacob expressing appreciation for the association's support and flowers for Harry Jacob.

#### **Treasurer**

Walt Schaller presented the Treasurer's report, indicating a balance of \$4551.46 as of the end of February 1998. The report was accepted as submitted.

#### **Old Business**

#### **Nationality Room - Spring Fund Raising event**

Discussion of the Spring Fund Raising event at the Teutonia May 2 focused on communications, scheduling, and food. Dr. Kunz will prepare a mailing to the 400+ Swiss nationals in the region regarding the fund raiser and the Nationality Room effort. The association's mailer will go out the week of March 30, 1998. The association will also mail announcements to the Pitt Nationality Room department, other area ethnic associations, and general PR contacts.

Scheduled entertainment includes the Maennerchor, an Alphorn player, a bell player, the Kinderchor, and the band. Also on the schedule will be remarks by Fred Carlson, Dr. Kunz, and Trudy Kuenzi. In addition, there will be several times during the evening when auction results will be announced.

Walt will coordinate the availability of various food items. There was some discussion regarding the timing of the event, and the need to provide enough food so that people will not want to leave the event to have dinner elsewhere.

May 2 will be the target date for the formation of the Swiss Nationality Room Committee. At that time we will send a letter to Chancellor Nordenburg indicating our intent to create a Swiss Nationality Room, and requesting the University's support. The Board is confident that the target amount of \$5000 will be achieved through the existing account, the recent round of donations, and the results of the Fund Raising Event. The necessity of thorough recordkeeping of fund donors was brought up; this information will be kept in the Donor Book which will ultimately reside in the classroom. Dr. Kunz and Fred summarized the March 18, 1998 meeting with Nationality Room director Maxine Bruhns. Dr. Kunz also read a letter he received from Mrs. Bruhns congratulating the group on the initial stages of our effort. Benefits of affiliation with Pitt will include: availability of meeting rooms, public relations support, ability to use Pitt letterhead and have mailings handled through Pitt, and ongoing administrative and project support. The committee's formal affiliation with the University of Pittsburgh will further enable Dr. Kunz to correspond

on the committee's behalf with the appropriate Swiss diplomatic, cultural and business organizations to request further support and sponsorships.
